EXCURSION TO CAIRNIE.

ON Monday, a party of members of the Banffshire Field Club spent a most enjoyable day at Cairnie. They first visited Tillytarmont, and saw the sculptured stone there, under the leadership of Rev. Mr Annand and Mr Lipp of Haddoch. The party then went to Haddoch, and experienced Mr Lipp's kindness there, and saw the site of the old chapel on the farm of Haddoch, now disused. From that they proceeded by Comrie to the top of the Binn. The fine view was intercepted more or less by the growth of the trees about the top. Proceeding to the Elf House, one of the party entered and explored it to some extent. The Church of Cairnie was then visited, the Pitlurg aisle being an object of interest. Mr and Mrs Annand hospitably entertained the visitors at the Manse. Proceeding to the House of Auchanachie, the party were kindly shown over it by Mr Pirie, who had also made some preparation for receiving them at the Church of Riven. There they saw the effigy of Tam of Riven, the old cross of Riven, and heard the 'Wow of the Riven rung.' The party returned to Banff by evening train.
