MEETING AT BANFF.

THE ordinary meeting of this Club was held on Thursday evening in the Academy Buildings, Banff—Dr John Milne, King-Edward, in the chair. After election of members and some routine business,

THE LATE MR THOMAS EDWARD.

Mr RAMSAY, in accordance with the general feeling of those present, proposed that there should be recorded in the minutes of the Club an expression of sorrow at the death of Mr Thomas Edward, and sympathy with his relatives. Mr Edward was one of the two first vice-presidents of the Club, and at the first general meeting he read a paper, and had since read others. Mr Edward's life was devoted to studies which it was the special design of field clubs to promote.

It was agreed that the secretary should be requested to draw up a minute in accordance with the feeling of the meeting. The minute as drawn up set forth that the meeting 'unanimously resolved to enter in their minutes an expression of the deep regret with which the members of the Club had heard of the death of Mr Thomas Edward, A.L.S., a former Vice-President of the Club, who, by his assiduous labours, did so much to illustrate the natural history of the district, and even to extend the boundaries of Natural Science in general; and to tender to his widow and family their sincere sympathy with them in their sorrow.'

The Secretary was instructed to send an excerpt from the minute to Mrs Edward.
