CULBIN RELICS.

There were on exhibition a number of Culbin relics from the collection of Rev. John MacEwen, Dyke. These were briefly described by Mr George Bain, Nairn, who remarked that Mr MacEwen possessed the largest private collection of the kind he knew. He drew attention to some beautiful specimens of arrow heads, and tools, and manufactured articles of bronze, all of rare workmanship. The most famous find of all had been a bronze armlet. It was described as being most perfect, showing that whoever made it was capable of producing beautiful work. This bronze armlet was the first of the kind discovered in Scotland. The relics which so abounded at Culbin showed that the district must have been densely inhabited, that the people were very industrious, and that their industry flourished to such a degree that even at the present day their works called forth admiration, and in some instances could not be excelled.

The proceedings, which had been followed with interest by a good audience, terminated with votes of thanks to the writers of the papers proposed by Dr Cruickshank, Nairn. Mr Alexander Robertson, S.S.O., Nairn, was also thanked for presiding.
